PEOPLE AND PLANET FOSSIL FUEL DECLARATION

The Students' Union President Evan has been working with the UWE Bristol Directorate on signing the People and Planet's fossil-fuel free declaration. This is a declaration from the University that they hold no investments/holdings in fossil fuel extractor companies, and a commitment to not invest in future. The declaration will be signed and publicised at the end of January. This would make UWE the 93nd UK university to commit to divestment since the campaign began in 2014, with the previous being on November 2021. This has come about through the partnership working between UWE Bristol and The Students' Union.

THE SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE

The Students' Union Sustainability Committee have been recruited and trained by the Student Sustainability Engagement Coordinator. There are just over 30 students on the committee this year, with 20 being incredibly active. We have started weekly meetings and are beginning to plan our sustainability campaign for the week of $21^{st} - 25^{th}$ March 2022, the theme and details of the campaign will be decided in the coming weeks. Outside of our weekly committee meetings, some committee members have also been involved in other sustainability work, such as:

- Sustainable Food: Meeting with the vegan charity Viva! to organise some events for later in January, such as some student-led outreach stalls, a social media storm and a talk about Veganism.
- They have also launched a cheaper oat milk campaign with Veg Society, where they are campaigning for oat milk to be cheaper than cows' milk on campus and for it to be the default option when you get a hot drink.
- Some committee members have also come to a meeting with Rania (VP Community and Welfare) and Faith (Student Sustainability Engagement Coordinator) to discuss sustainable food at UWE and engage with The Sustainable Food Guide from SOS-UK.
- **Tree Planting**: Some committee members are helping me organise a tree planting session at the end of January with a local organisation called One Planet Matters.
- **Sustainable Fashion**: helping to make our clothes mending sessions more regular (run by a student). Some committee members of agreed to bring in clothes for our next clothes swap in February, and to help promote it and run it on the day with LGBT+ Society.
- Blog Posts: a number of committee members have been writing blog posts for our website
 on topics such as COP26, how to have a sustainable festive season and boycotting
 Amazon.

DECOLONISING ACTIVITY

As part of our annual SOS-UK/NUS Green Impact Accreditation, we have been set new criteria to proactively support decolonising and decarbonising action:

"Decolonising an institution and union goes beyond practices like diversifying the curriculum. Decolonising is not just about addressing the legacies of colonialism, like racism and

social inequalities, in degree outcomes and the contents of the taught curriculum, but also in the activities, operations and culture of the institution and union.

Decolonising practices are most effective alongside decarbonising initiatives to realise climate justice and a fairer world for all. For example:

- Celebrating and valuing a wide range of knowledge systems and expertise in relation to climate action (such as Indigenous knowledge).
- Divesting from fossil fuels and the inequalities that reliance on fossil fuels perpetuates.
- Exploring how HR and recruitment practices can improve wellbeing and create more inclusive and sustainable work environments."

To this end, Students' Union colleagues are discussing examples with the EDI Team and looking at synergies between supporting strategies. The Students' Union is also helping to organise, plan and promote the 'Decolonising the Faculty of Environment and Technology seminar series' (3 seminars are arranged for Feb-March).

We are also discussing with Fabia Jeddere-Fisher and other colleagues the possibility of arranging another seminar series in April titled 'Decolonise and Decarbonise', collaborating with the African Voices Forum and Black and Green Ambassadors. We have interest from Sustainability Committee members in organising these sessions.

GREENER FUTURES

We have launched our Greener Futures Accreditation 2021-22, which is our sustainability competition for sports clubs and societies. 17 student groups are taking part and are now completing the challenges in the Greener Futures workbook. Challenges include signing petitions, coming to our events, volunteering in the local community, running their own sustainability campaign, etc. Here are some examples of what they've been up to so far:

Sustainable Food:

- Vegananuary competition The Green Team and Halls Life: students are sending in their favourite recipes and the winner gets a vegan hamper.
- We are also exploring more food growing options on campus with Richie (Grounds Manager).

Feel Good February:

- Free Sustainable Period Products ('try something new'): We will be having a stall on each
 campus during Feel Good Feb for 'Try Something New' week where students will be able to
 order free sustainable period products, such as period pants, reusable pads, and menstrual
 cups. Sustainability Committee volunteers will be helping to run these and chatting with other
 students about the benefits of using sustainable period products.
- Climate Anxiety Café for staff and students (with Vicki Harris) will return to our events programme.
- We will be offered Green Campus Tours (with Vicki Harris).

Fairtrade Fortnight: planning talks and social media promotion with Vicki Harris.

Biodiversity, green projects, conservation:

- Regular Community Garden sessions (every other Wednesday from 12-3 during term time).
- Conservation Volunteering Day at Splatts Abbey Wood is organised for 12th February and we are hoping to have these sessions run regularly.

ESD and Sustainability Careers – Bristol SU Collaboration:

 We are in conversation with Bristol SU to share resources and ideas about Education for Sustainable Development (ESD), Decolonise and Sustainable Careers, we meet every couple of months to share ideas and we are hoping to do a collaborative event sometime this academic year about ESD.

New e-learning package:

- The Green Team has purchased an e-learning package from One Planet Matters which covers topics of Social and Environmental Justice. The Sustainability Committee are going to help promote this to students, as well as offering to Students' Union staff.
- We hope this will be a fantastic addition alongside the emerging Carbon Literacy module in development.
